70% from Williamson County 25% - Neighboring counties Only 5% are Transients

A middle aged single female found a job at a local restaurant and housing in the local area.

A single male lost his job and home, because of health reasons. He has since recovered and found employment and housing.

A family of four came to us from a "bunking in" situation with a former relative. The family consisted of father, mother, a 2-year-old daughter and a 3-year-old son. They had applied for section 8 housing and were on the waiting list. They moved into their new home last week. We helped with available furniture and household items.

A male resident with a CDL was able to secure a job as a truck driver in another state.

A couple came to us because of lost employment. She was pregnant but he was able to obtain employment. They rented an apartment in Marion.

A single female, who had lost her home, found employment from a female seeking a caretaker for room and board.

A single male who had not been able to work for over a year, found employment and permanent housing.

A single mother came to the shelter with two of her three children. We assisted her in finding affordable permanent housing to accommodate all three children and she was re-united with her son.



Marion Second Baptist Church volunteers spent a Saturday morning helping to organize the pole barn that houses shelter supplies and household items for those moving into their own apartment.






The Church of Latter day Saints spent the following Saturday morning completing the project. Thanks so much to both groups for supplying a much needed mission.
